

Urban living labs


- Important innovation potential for societal challenges

- 52 urban living labs are funded and implemented in European urban settings
- More in the pipeline...
- Address a broad range of issues including urban governance, water management, eparticipation, mobility management, interethnic co-existence, stakeholder involvment, etc.

Hence urban living labs are:

- Challenge driven

These characteristics are also reflected by current challenges in the urban living lab approach:

- Equity and inclusiveness
- Integration in local and regional 'proper' governance
- Capacity building in public administrations





- Design: Longer term assessment and comparative analysis on how they are formed
- Stabilisation and operation: increase conceptual and reflexive understanding
- Impact: reshape our understanding of urban transitions and ULL local particluarities
