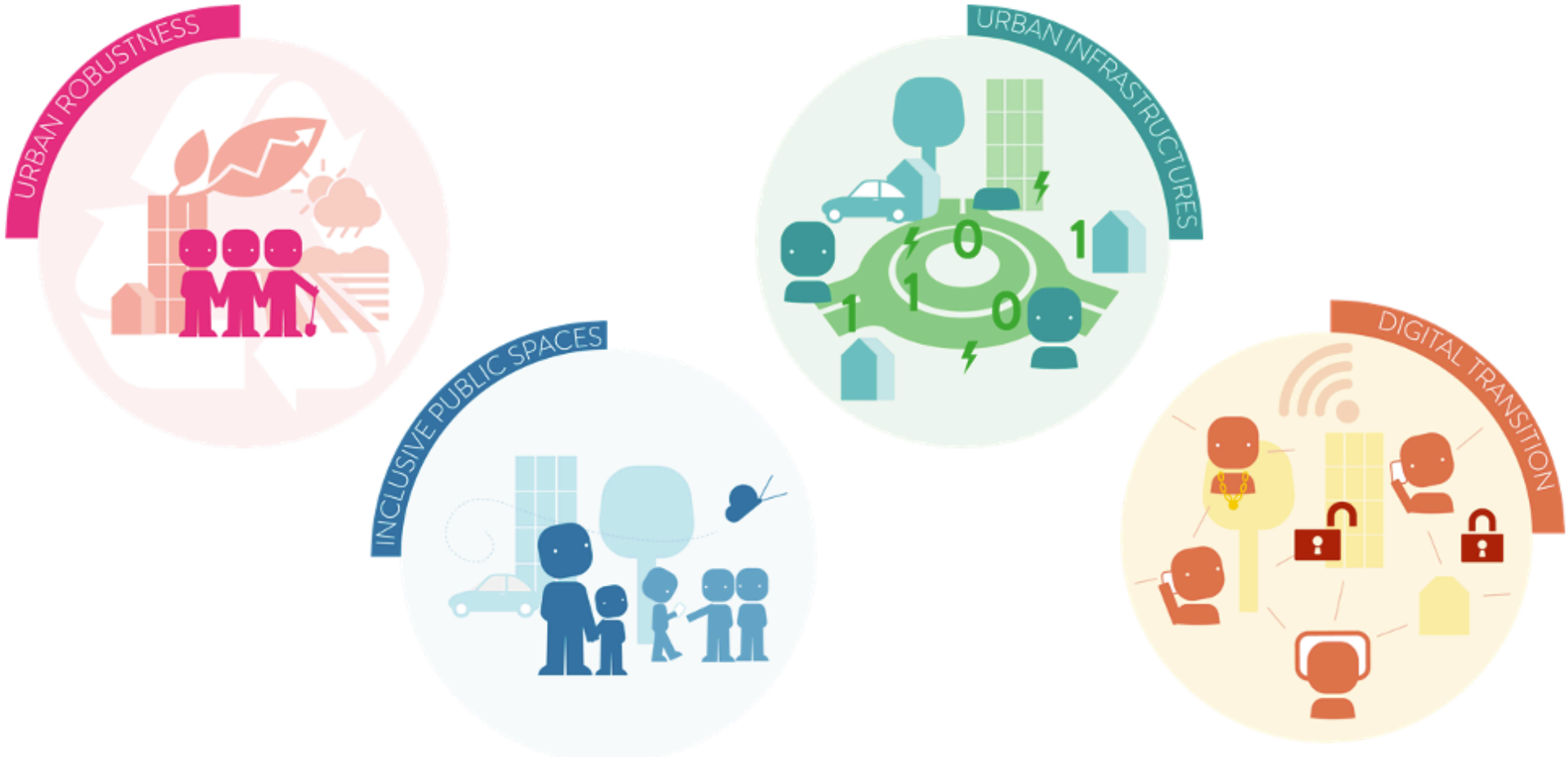


Definition: Urban Dilemmas

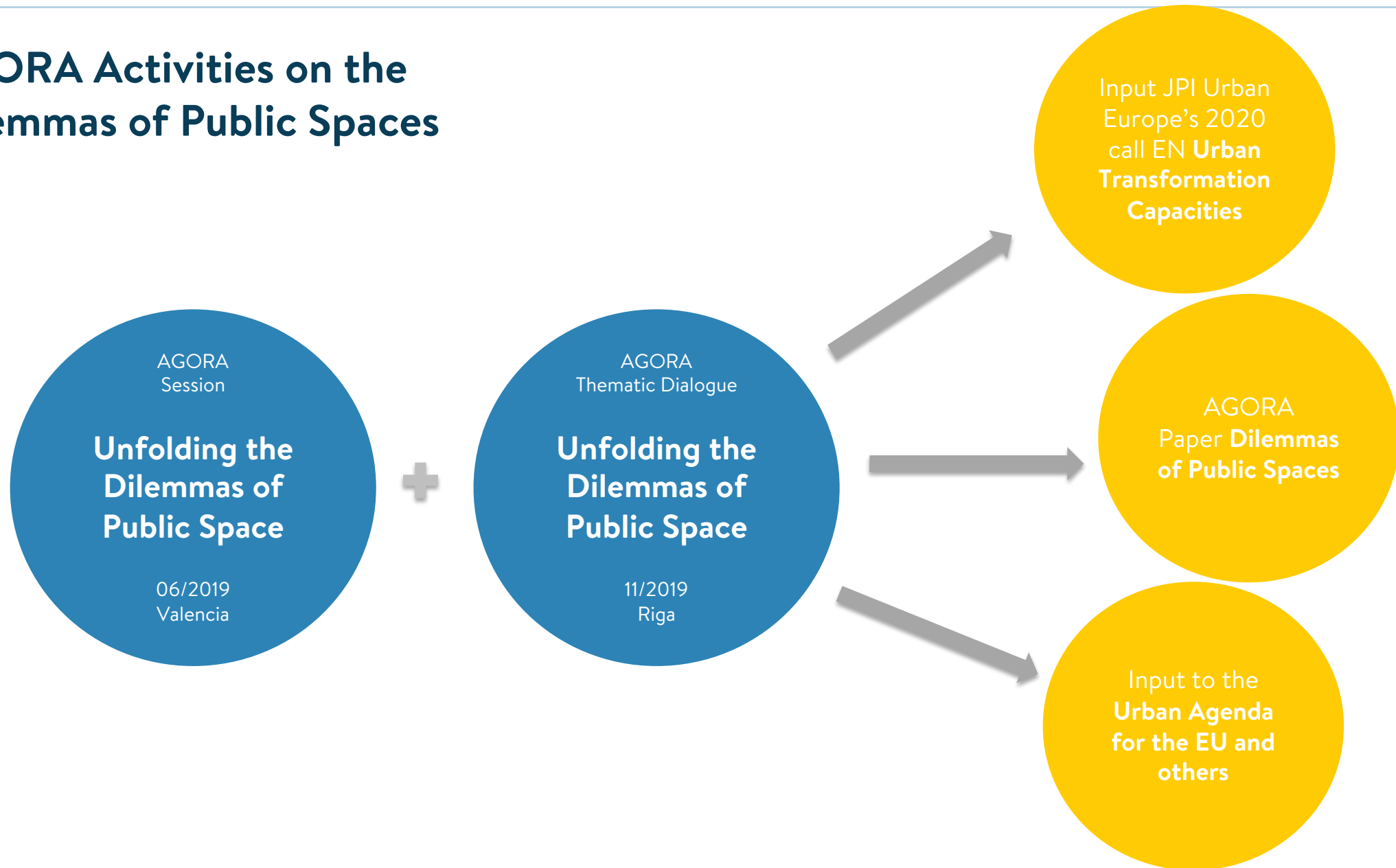
