Outcome

To understanding the spatial footprint of mobility behaviour, introducing more meaning than the mere movement in space, essentially social and cultural dimensions, and focussing on the issues of **appropriation of space**.

- In this vein P Costa presented the individual appropriation process of architectural developments for disabled persons homes, with homes seen as an equivalent of a public space in terms of accessibility.

The theme of territorialisation also stresses the **roles of local institutions** in dealing with mobility issues. Institutional barriers are often overlapped by spatial behaviour, which challenges the public policies, as is patent in the urban developments in Italy and in and around Rome in particular, as shown by Romina D'Ascanio, Anna Laura Palazzo.
