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1: Results – What are your most promising results so far?

- Awareness rising and initiation of local discourses around the FWE nexus and sustainable urban development
- Bringing people in one room that normally do not communicate
- Knowledge on nexus structures, nexus literacy and governance
 - Lack of awareness of FWE linkages at the local level
 - Lack of capacity to develop integrated governance or management strategies in this area.
 - The research conducted identified challenges and opportunities associated with the integrated management of food, energy, and water systems.
- Co-design of an IT tool and using it to gather data and to discuss food, water and energy management systems.
- Story maps and other Urban FWE visualization methods (work in progress)
- · Participatory Modeling and building of a qualitative model











Participatory Modeling

Impact: supporting the co-creation of a common understanding of the interdependencies and conflicts through vizualisation











Citizen Science tool development

- Open-source technologies (OGC and ISO conform)
- Based on the WQ framework
- Data feedback loop with local administration

2: Impacts - What do you expect to be the most important short term and long term impacts from your SUGI project?

Local level

- Fostering networking and visibility of needs, ideas and initiatives as well as the integration of bottom-up approaches in local governance (short term and long term).
- Awareness and knowledge regarding the FWE nexus and potentials for sustainability governance (incl. data and visualizations) and integration of FWE concept elements into local governance (e.g. transverse thinking, integrated governance); increasing efficiency of local sustainability strategies (short and long term)
- Increase of local knowledge co-creation and participation through developed/adapted tools and experiences (short and long term)
- → capacity building in cities and cross-sector urban policies, changes in thinking and practice

Research

- Advance knowledge on nexus structures, nexus literacy and governance
- Co-design of an IT tool and using it to gather data and to discuss food, water and energy management systems → Increased openness of research through tested knowledge co-creation tools
- Better science communication; easier understanding of the FWE nexus
- Advancement of Inter- and transdisciplinary research









Slide 3: Approaches - How will you go about to realize these impacts? What is your approach?

Main aspects:

- Engaging stakeholders from the beginning of the project.
- Building on the real local needs and on specific starting points by linking to
 problems important for local communities; e.g. by choosing a starting point
 chosen with them and then focusing the attention of the stakeholders to the links
 with other subsystems.
- Collaborative knowledge co-creation and search for solutions with engaged stakeholders (workshops, strong cooperation with local institutions, data collection and communication tool)
- Learn and adjust
- Develop strong visualizations









4: Networking and Capacity Building - What support in terms of collaboration with other SUGI projects and dedicated activities from the SUGI implementation team do you need to realize these impacts?

- Exchange of experience on specific activities and aspects
- Visibility of specific interests and approaches in the projects (who could I approach for what topic?)
- Common evaluation meeting, supporting the development of the final project evaluation recommendations. Help for formulating cross-project policy recommendations.
- Joint publications (book, special issue, non-scientific forum)
- Support organization of conference sessions (e.g. IST conference)
- Knowledge transfer workshop for policy and practice at different levels
