

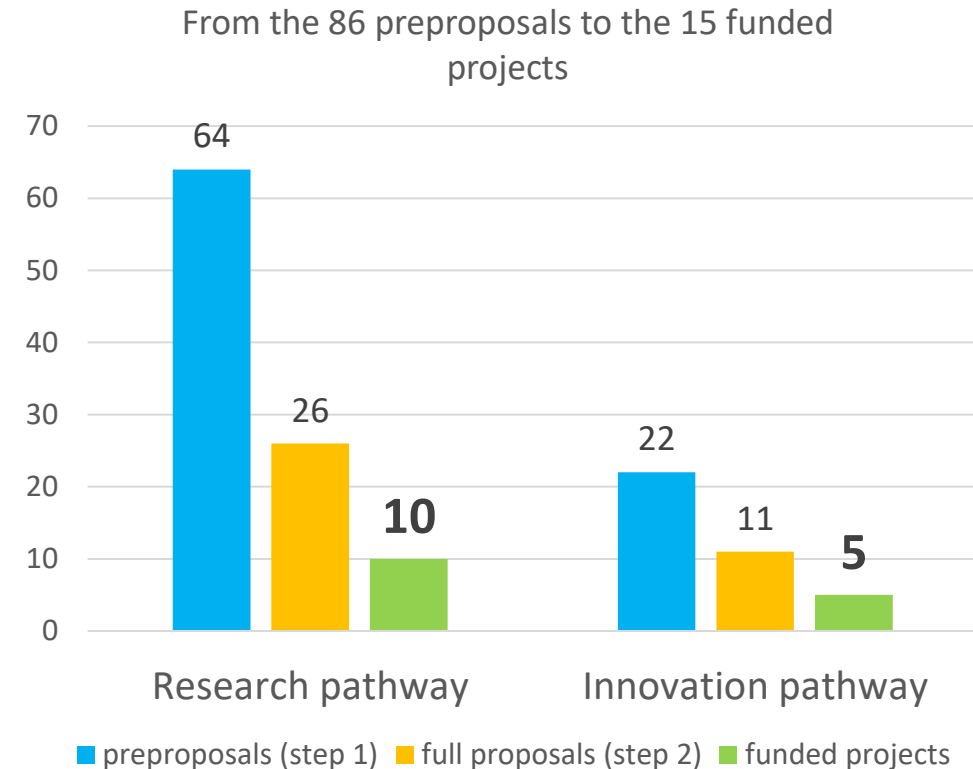

  - pay attention to the schedule, be careful about the deadlines (we have almost no room for a duration extension beyond what was planned!)
  - dissemination and translation of the results towards end-users and practitioners (from cities, from companies...)
  - contribution to the objectives of the overall EN-UAC programme



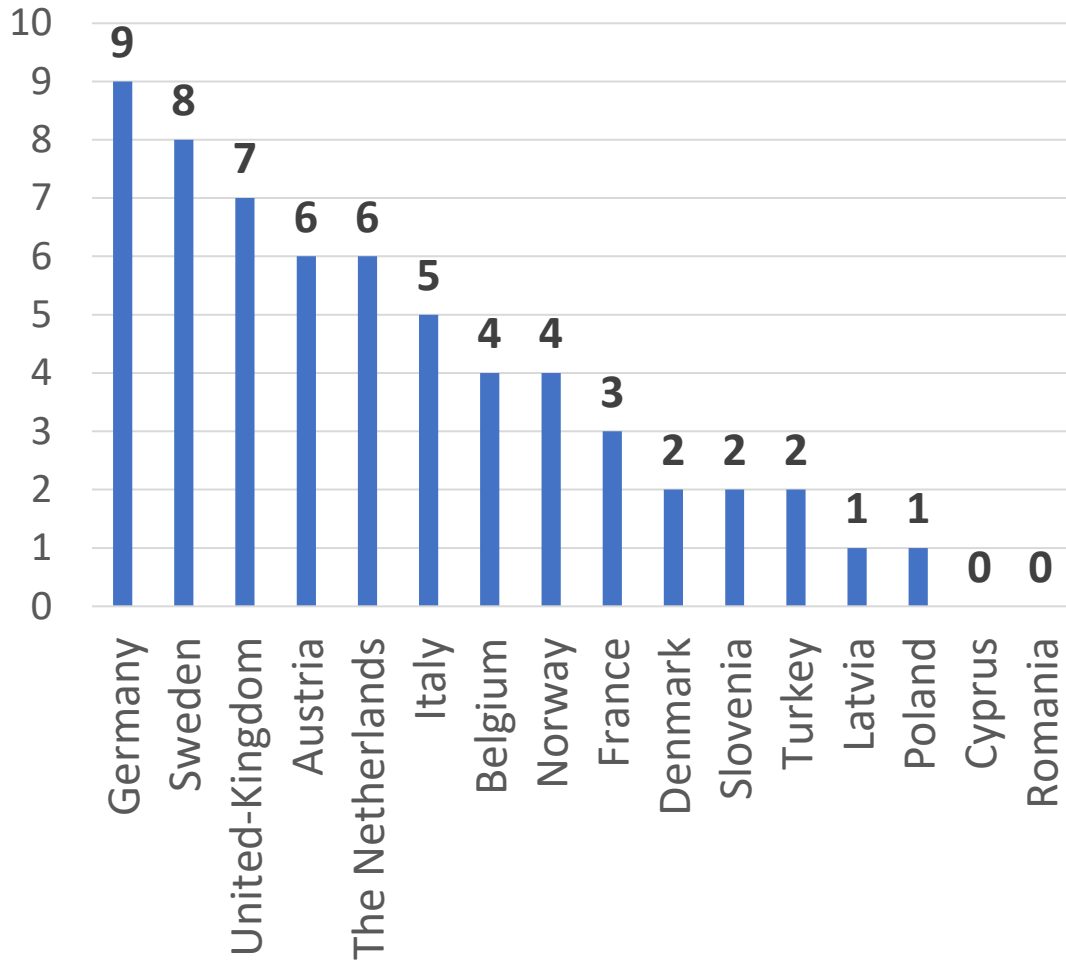

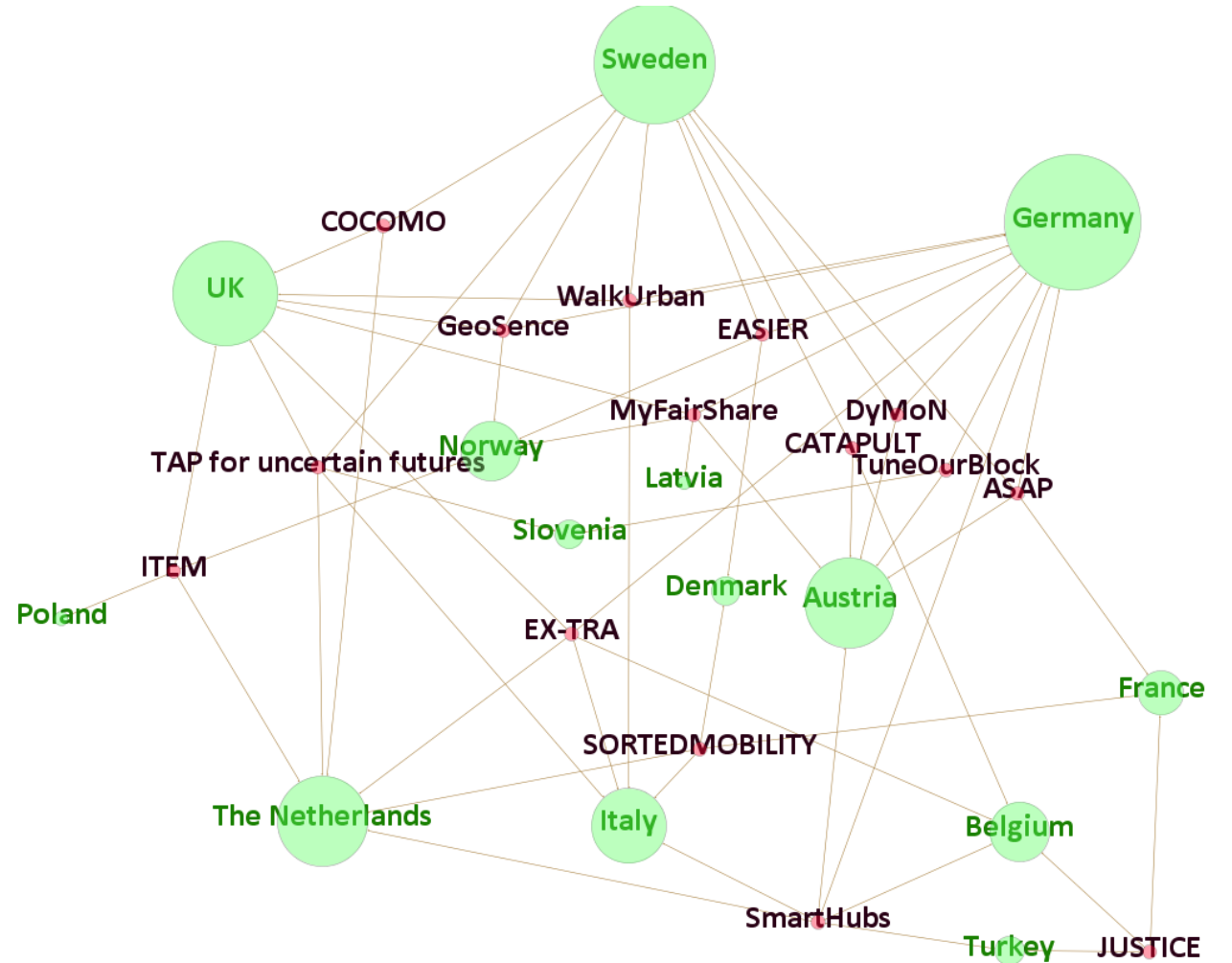


# Countries involvements into the selected projects

# ERA-NET Cofund “Urban Accessibility and Connectivity” strategic objectives

- 1. implementing joint calls for R&I projects** (addressing to city authorities’ needs, with stakeholder’s involvement);
- 2. monitor of / interaction between funded projects:** project progress & embedding into the wider JPI Urban Europe programme;
- 3. broad communication, dissemination and exploitation of results:** for policy makers, urban practitioners and citizens; **enhance impact of projects;**
- 4. cooperation between the JPI Urban Europe/EN-UAC and other EC funded actions:** synergies with CIVITAS or EIT Urban Mobility activities, feeding of the ELTIS database (guidelines, good practices and tools for practitioners)...;
- 5. community of research and practice:** build capacities for transitions towards sustainable urban mobility, establish links with other projects and activities of the JPI Urban Europe (knowledge hub + Agora);

## **Expected outcomes and impacts (based on your projects!):**

- develop shared scientific knowledge, tools, innovations and technologies supporting a more sustainable and inclusive urban mobility;
- widespread best practices and adequate tools to manage better urban mobility;
- help urban policies in their decisions impacting urban mobility, accessibility and connectivity (like the SUMP and SULPs);
- favor the development of transport modes and mobility services with less environmental footprint while maintaining social equity and inclusion and helping economic development;
- connection to earlier or existing European, national, regional research and innovation (R&I) actions or initiatives
